CHILD PROTECTION OBLIGATIONS OF THIS PARISH

This Procedure sets out what Church workers must do when they receive information and the control of the contro when they receive information concerning child sexual abuse and obligations on parishioners:

Parishioners need to report allegations or information received in relation to child sexual abuse, whether such abuse is historical or current to the parish 'Safequarders'. They are Tony Rigby and Lisa Hooper. Their contact details are on the posters here in the church and the Maheno Room. If in doubt, discuss with them and we'll contact the Office of Professional Standards. It is mandatory, as soon as reasonably practicable, a church worker (clergy, wardens, parish councillors and volunteers) must report all allegations or information received concerning child sexual abuse to the Diocesan Office of Professional Standards and to the local police or **Policelink on 131 444.** Failure to report is a misdemeanor under the Criminal Code and can carry a maximum penalty of 3 years imprisonment.

READINGS AND PRAYERS FOR TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

SENTENCE FOR THE DAY:

The Lord is near to all who call on him in truth. He fulfils the desire of all that fear him, hears their cry, and saves them.

*Psalm 145.18–19**

THE COLLECT FOR THE DAY:

O God, giver of life and health, whose Son Jesus Christ has called us to hunger and thirst for justice: refresh us with your grace, that we may not be weary in well-doing, for the sake of him who meets all our needs, Jesus Christ our Saviour; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

FIRST READING: GENESIS 32.22–31 FELICITY SCOTT LINDA MITCHELL

The same night he got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him.

Then he said, 'Let me go, for the day is breaking.' But Jacob said, 'I will not let you go, unless you bless me.' So he said to him, 'What is your name?' And he said, 'Jacob.' Then the man said, 'You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed.' Then Jacob asked him, 'Please tell me your name.' But he said, 'Why is it that you ask my name?' And there he blessed him. So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, 'For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved.'

The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip.

PSALM 17.1-7, 17.16

- 1. Hear my just cause, O Lord, give heed to my cry: listen to my prayer, that comes from no lying lips.

Second Reading: Romans 9.1–8 Sarah Davies Tony Rigby
I am speaking the truth in Christ—I am not lying; my conscience confirms it by the
Holy Spirit—I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish
that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people, my
kindred according to the flesh. They are Israelites, and to them belong the adoption,
the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; to
them belong the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, comes the
Messiah, who is over all, God blessed for ever. Amen. It is not as though the word of
God had failed. For not all Israelites truly belong to Israel, and not all of Abraham's
children are his true descendants; but 'It is through Isaac that descendants shall be
named after you.' This means that it is not the children of the flesh who are the
children of God, but the children of the promise are counted as descendants.

GOSPEL: MATTHEW 14.13-21 Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Now when Jesus heard this, he withdrew from there in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds heard it, they followed him on foot from thetowns. When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, 'This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves.' Jesus said to them, 'They need not go away; you give them something to eat.' They replied, 'We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish.' And he said, 'Bring them here to me.' Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.
